2020 was a year filled with hope, joy and challenges. Yet, with your support, we were able to continue our mission to build hope and transform lives of the orphans, vulnerable children and their communities in Songea and Lutukira.

2020 began with the joy of a young child named Juma, who joined the Songea's Kids program and received a life changing prosthetic that took him from crutches to the soccer field. With the onset of the COVID-19 global pandemic, with your support, we were able to maintain our focus on safe shelter, food, clothing, health care and education, and also move quickly to address this new challenge to keep the kids and their communities safe.

At Hope Village, we completed construction of the Rotary Health Care Dispensary and the Masonry Vocational Training classroom, and drilled a new water well that provides solar pumped water into both new buildings. The dream of quality health care and educational opportunity came closer to fruition.

As 2020 came to a close, our co-founder, Linda Hines, announced her retirement as President, and her move into her new role as Chair of our Advisory Board, where she focuses on ways to deepen our impact.

In this report, you will read some of the many stories of lives transforming, of communities being strengthened, and hope transcending despair and poverty. We believe in the future and are so grateful to you, our community.



# **OUR IMPACT IN 2020**

### **COVID-19 PREVENTION**

In 2020, COVID-19 presented the world with challenges on a massive scale. Our Songea's Kids community responded to the crisis and helped us to protect the children, their caretakers and their communities. The Sammamish Rotary and private donors provided critical funding to protect and save lives. In Songea, our local NGO partner, Jirani Mwema, distributed training materials in KiSwahili, provided home-based hygienic systems to each child's home, and trained their sewing cooperative to create face masks for distribution to children, their caretakers and their communities.

Thankfully, our kids, their caretakers and community remained safe.

# **OUR IMPACT IN 2020**

### **COVID-19 PREVENTION**

Hope Village Organization, our local NGO partner, with a generous grant from the Sammamish Rotary Club, launched a community outreach program to villages throughout the Madaba District to provide COVID-19 prevention training and PPE. As part of the grant from the Rotary, Hope Village Organization purchased sewing machines and organized local village women to create a sewing cooperative that produced 7000 face masks for distribution.

# CHILD SPONSORSHIP

### CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS: JUMA'S STORY

Every now and then, something so extraordinary happens that it makes your heart burst with joy. During our trip to Songea in September 2019, while visiting a local primary school, we met a young child walking on crutches. We learned that one day, while he had been working in the field, he was bit by a snake, resulting in the amputation of the lower part of his leg. His headmaster pleaded that Songea's Kids bring him into our program. When we returned to the US, we sought out sponsorship for him and a very generous family agreed not only to sponsor him for his basic needs, but also to provide funds for a prosthetic. In 2020, Juma, who had been confined to the sidelines while his school friends ran on the soccer field, set down his crutches and joined the game. # **CHILD SPONSORSHIP**

### **MEETING BASIC NEEDS**

In 2020, our USA child sponsors provided 65 kids with safe shelter, food, clothing, education and health care. In addition, 17 new kids in urgent need obtained sponsors.

When new kids join the Songea's Kids program, most live in extremely harsh conditions, lacking what we would consider to be essential: a safe home, a bed to sleep in, nutritious food to eat and basic health care to treat the many illnesses endemic to the area, especially malaria, which is a major cause of death for children under 5 years old. One widely recognized way to prevent malaria is by providing mosquito netting for children as they sleep.

### Lazaki's Story

When Lazaki joined our program, he faced extreme food insecurity, lacked access to basic health care, and slept on the floor, with no bedding or mosquito netting to protect him from malaria. Thanks to his Songea's Kids sponsor, he now has three meals each day, clean clothing and shoes, a new bed with mosquito netting, and is able to see a doctor when ill. With the basic needs met, he is an avid learner in nursery school.

# 2020 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

# EDUCATION TRANSFORMS LIVES

We recognize that education is the key to breaking the cycle of poverty. Thanks to the generosity of our sponsors, each child in our program is supported from pre-primary through secondary school or vocational training, and several have graduated from college and university. When graduating from our program, each young adult has the knowledge, skills and ability to support themselves and their future families. In 2020:

- Two university students are studying transport management.
- Four students in teacher's college, including three who obtained their diplomas in Fall 2020 and one who is expected to graduate in 2021.
- Four "A" level students, positioned to enter university in 2021
- 10 vocational school students studying carpentry, tailoring, welding, tailoring or plumbing, including four who graduated in December.
- 13 students are in secondary school, 23 in primary school, and 9 in preprimary school.



### HOPE VILLAGE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Since 2016, Songea's Kids has partnered with Hope Village Organization to build a residential orphan haven where orphaned and abandoned children can live, grow and thrive in a nurturing environment. Once completed, Hope Village will have residential housing for 140 orphans, on-site health care, education and entrepreneurship opportunities.

It is no small task to build an entire village in a remote, impoverished rural area. However, with land donated by the villagers of Lutukira, pro-bono expertise donated by top Seattle-area architects and engineers, funds donated by many caring organizations and individuals, and time donated by countless volunteers, Hope Village is becoming a reality!

- The Hope Village Rotary Health Care Dispensary is fully constructed, furnished and equipped, and ready to meet the health needs of villagers in the Madaba District.
- The Hope Village Masonry Classroom is fully constructed, furnished and equipped, and it is working on the government certification approvals required for opening.
- Hope Village constructed a second deep water well that uses solar power to pump water into the new buildings.
- Hope Village installed solar panels to provide electricity to the new buildings

### HOPE VILLAGE ROTARY HEALTHCARE DISPENSARY



Early diagnosis and treatment prevent deaths from such illnesses as malaria, typhoid, cholera, HIV/AIDs and others. The Hope Village Rotary Health Care Dispensary will provide comprehensive, life saving health care to the community.

- Facility has 12 fully equipped rooms, including a birthing center, laboratory, pharmacy, reception and patient treatment rooms
- First health care facility to meet the prevention, diagnostic and treatment needs of the poorest villagers in the region
- Specialized Birthing Center provides pre-natal, delivery and post-natal care to promote healthy mothers and babies





## HOPE VILLAGE MASONRY VOCATIONAL TRAINING CLASSROOM



The Hope Village Masonry Vocational Training Class will provide local village youth with the opportunity to gain valuable skills to support themselves and their future families, breaking the cycle of poverty. A key part of the curriculum for the masonry students will be the practical application of their learning by helping with construction of future Hope Village buildings.






# HOPE VILLAGE WATER PROJECT

Phase One of the Hope Village Masonry was completed in 2020. This project was funded by the Sammamish Rotary and several Seattle area Rotary Clubs, Living Water, Friends of Tanzania, and many other generous individual donors. In 2016, the first well was drilled and gifted to the local villagers of Lutukira, who provided the land for Hope Village. For the first time, they had access to clean water and no longer needed to walk miles to bring water to their homes for cooking and washing.

In 2017, the first well at Hope Village was drilled, providing clean, hand pumped water onsite.

In 2020 a third well was drilled and a solar pump installed to provide clean, piped water into the Rotary Health Care Dispensary and the Masonry Vocational Training Classroom.





# HOPE VILLAGE LEVERAGES LOCAL RESOURCES IN CONSTRUCTION


Hope Village makes use of local materials and labor for construction, and to harness the power of the sun for electricity and pumped water. From the bricks constructed on-site that use local soil and a minimum of cement, to the solar energy that pumps water into the buildings and the solar panels that provide electricity, Hope Village Organization and the pro-bono team of architects and engineers leverage local resources for both sustainability and to provide employment opportunities to local villagers.







# SONGEA'S KIDS 2020 INCOME




