To our Songea's Kids Community,

With the pandemic continuing throughout 2021, the year challenged us all to think creatively on different ways to achieve our goals. Thankfully, with the support of our volunteers, probono experts, and donor community, we continued to make an impact on the lives of the orphans, vulnerable children and their communities in southern Tanzania.

In this report, we will share with you some of the moving stories that touched our hearts this past year. Special highlights for 2021 include the grand opening of the Hope Village Rotary Health Care Dispensary in April to provide quality and life saving preventive, diagnostic and treatment services to local village families. Also at Hope Village, the Masonry Vocational Training Classroom received certification from the Government of Tanzania, hired staff, and began enrollment in anticipation of opening in January 2022.

2021 also saw an expansion of our child sponsorship program to add five new children in Songea and the launch of a similar sponsorship program in Lutukira, outside Hope Village. Our focus on transforming lives through education demonstrated that if you provide children with the support they need to learn, they will do their best to achieve their potential in life. In 2021, we celebrated the joyful graduation of two young students with Bachelor degrees in Transport Management, and four students who obtained their certifications in in electricity, welding, mechanics and carpentry from vocational training programs. We also gave a joyful send-off to four students who began their college/university careers studying biotechnology, IT, multimedia and horticulture. They are working towards a future where they will have knowledge and skills to become self-supporting adults.

All of this, and so much more, is made possible by you--our donors, child sponsors, pro-bono technical experts and our volunteers. Thank you!

Child Sponsorship Highlights

In 2021, child sponsorship continued to transform lives and strengthen communities. In total, we provided 62 children with safe places to live, nutritious food to eat, clean clothes to wear at home and at school, quality health care and education. Seven new children in urgent need joined our programs in 2021: five in Songea and two in our newly launched child sponsorship program in Lutukira with Hope Village.

Child Sponsorship

In December 2021, Songea's Kids launched a new child sponsorship program to help address the widespread and devastating poverty of orphans and vulnerable children in the communities surrounding Hope Village. The first two children to enter the program are Grace and Fatina, pictured below in front of their homes on the day they joined the child sponsorship program.



Grace and Fatina live in Lutukira, one of the most impoverished villages in the region. In their short lives, they have experienced such tragic loss and deprivation. Grace's father abandoned the family when she was five years old, and she is being raised by her mother, who has HIV/AIDs. Fatina's mother abandoned her family and she and her four siblings are being raised by their father, a poor, subsistence farmer. Yet, despite the tragedy in their young lives, both are avid learners in school and hold dreams for a better future. With child sponsorship that provides basic needs, education and encouragement, they now have the support they need to turn dreams into reality.

Children with Special Needs are Never Left Behind

When it comes to caring for children, there is no "one size fits all" approach at Songea's Kids. We recognize that some children have special needs and we ensure that they receive support that is tailored to them so that they can live their best lives. We have long supported children with needs ranging from the hearing impaired, physical mobility, learning disabilities and more.

In 2021, we brought a new child into our program. Debora is a young girl filled with the love of life. An eager student, she quickly thrived with the support of her basic and educational needs. Sadly, soon after joining our program, Debora was also diagnosed with cancer, a heartbreaking situation for her and her grandfather, who is her caretaker.

Thanks to her generous sponsor and to those who donate to our Greatest Needs Fund, we were able to find specialized treatment for Debora at a hospital in Dar es Salaam and arrange for flexible schooling arrangements so she would not fall behind. With specialized medical care, enhanced nutrition, and the support of tutors, Debora is able to continue her studies.

Education Transforms Lives

At Songea's Kids, we know that it is not enough to meet a child's basic needs. To break the cycle of poverty, education is the key. Having the knowledge, skills and ability to support themselves and their future families is the gift that will transform their lives and strengthen their communities.

All the children in our program are enrolled in school and each child is encouraged to achieve his or her potential. If a child is struggling, we identify a tutor to provide the extra help they need. We support all of their education costs, from school fees, to uniforms, and supplies from primary school through secondary school or vocational training. Many are now obtaining college and university educations.

Education by the Numbers

- 33 in primary school
- 11 in secondary school
- 4 in "A" level
- 8 in vocational training
- 6 at college/university



Grand Opening of the Hope Village Rotary Health Care Dispensary

In April 2021, Hope Village Organization opened the Rotary Health Care Dispensary, the first facility to provide local villagers with access to high quality preventive, diagnostic, and treatment services. Opening day was filled with joy as villagers gathered to celebrate.

Rotary Health Care Dispensary Highlights

The Hope Village Rotary Dispensary has 12 fully equipped rooms, including a birthing center, laboratory, pharmacy, reception and patient treatment rooms.

Patient Diagnostics and Treatment

For the first time, local villagers have access to a modern health care facility, with highly trained medical staff, diagnostic technology and a fully stocked pharmacy.

One special feature of the Rotary Health Care Dispensary is the Birthing Center, the first of its kind in the region. Local women were amazed to learn that the center was developed especially for them, providing prenatal, delivery and post-natal care to promote maternal/baby health.

Hope Village Masonry Vocational Training Program

Hope Village is committed to providing a range of vocational training programs that will provide impoverished rural village youth with valuable skills to support themselves and break the cycle of poverty. The first vocational training program scheduled to open will be the Masonry Vocation Training Classroom. In late 2021, Hope Village Organization hired staff and began enrolling students for its first vocational atraining program, with a planned January 2022 opening.



The building was designed by pro-bono architectural expertise from a leading Seattle-based firm. It was constructed using locally available materials, and utilizes solar powered electricity and water. The deep water well and solar pump provide clean water to the building, thanks to the pro-bono expertise provided by Seattle-area water engineers. Local villagers provided labor for construction, learning valuable skills such as brick-making, truss assembly and more. Special donors provided funding for construction, building furnishings and equipment.

Future vocational training offerings planned by Hope Village include tailoring, carpentry, electricity, plumbing, computer science and more.

First Students To Enroll are Looking forward to the Masonry Classroom Opening in January 2022!

It was exciting to see the first two students enrolled are local female students. Magreth and Noerina are breaking gender barriers in a traditionally male-oriented profession.



Both received scholarship funding to attend. Upon completion of the two year program, each will have a certification that designates their expertise, opening doors to future employment opportunities. There are many who would like to obtain this training, but lack the funds to enroll. Songea's Kids will continue to expand access to scholarships through donations to our Education Fund.





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Our Goals for 2022

Child Sponsorship Program

We know that by providing nurturing homes, nutritious food, clean water, health care and education, we can save and transform the life of an orphan or vulnerable child. In 2022, we hope to reach more children in urgent need in Songea and Lutukira and strengthen the services we provide. We aim to:

- Add 10 new children in urgent need to our program
- Fund university for three students who passed their national entrance exams and are eligible to begin studies in Fall 2022
- Enhance tutoring and mentoring programs
- Launch housing improvement initiatives to repair aging homes of the orphans and vulnerable children we support

Hope Village Development

Hope Village is envisioned to become a residential haven for abandoned orphans and vulnerable children who have nowhere to turn. Our next project will be to construct the residential orphan homes. Hope Village will be a thriving center to support both the orphans and the rural community with clean water, health care, education and vocational training, and entrepreneurial opportunities. With Hope Village, we aim to transform lives, and break the cycle of poverty. In 2022, we plan to:

- Initiate construction of the first residential orphan home for orphaned and abandoned babies and children at Hope Village
- Construct a laundry room to serve Hope Village
- Raise funds to construct a new well to support future growth at Hope Village
